Finally, may we thank everybody for coming tonight, and for keeping to the Covid 19 rules during these difficult times; we hope that you will all have a safe journey home.



# FEATURE: Shane Murphy

**The County Ground proves familiar territory for former Hamworthy goalkeeper Shane Murphy, as he re-joined Tim Sills and the squad this season after spells with both Dorchester and AFC Totton.**

Ahead of Hamworthy's league encounter with Shaftesbury, we caught up with the stopper to discuss all things Hammers:

**What's been the biggest, football related difficulty you've faced in the last six months?**

"For me it was the fear of the unknown, nobody had any idea when the season would start or if there would be a season at all, which made it all the more difficult to prepare both mentally and physically.

"However, in turn that made it all the more important for me to get signed on and begin to knuckle down as much as possible."

**What's your biggest quality as a footballer?**

"It always a tough one when you're talking about yourself, but I would say I'm a very strong communicator and distributor of the ball, I like to think I give the squad confidence because I'm behind them."

**Are there any areas in which you could improve?**

"It's important to recognise you can always improve on all aspects of your game, that being said I don't like to identify one specific area because it's about squeezing

out those extra percent's in all areas.

"I feel if you focus all your attention on one area, you'll find you miss out on something else, which could prove your downfall in a game."

**How would you rate Hamworthy's start to the campaign?**

"The start to this campaign has been really strong and shows that we're definitely going to be in and around the top pack all season. It's important for us to sustain that hunger and form in every game to come.

"Personally, I'm pleased with my start as well, and adjusting to the league as a whole. However, as I mentioned earlier no matter how well you play you never stop learning and improving, as long as you have the desire to do so."

**What personal, football related goals do you have?**

"Coming to Hamworthy for me was really important as it gave me the opportunity to keep playing in what's been a difficult time with COVID in my working life.

"The goal this season is 100 percent to achieve promotion, and I see no reason why we can't do that as long as we sustain the mentality we've entered the season with so far. It would be great to be involved in a journey like that."

Fourth placed Hamworthy had dropped only two points from their three league games. The Purps though would not be an easy obstacle, having taken four points off United last term, and being well in the mix for the title when the season's results were expunged in March.

In a lively opening, United were given a very early scare when Scott Hills' effort for the Purps was only half stopped by Shane Murphy, with Crit Clarke on hand to clear the ball off the line.

It was though the Hammers who opened the scoring on 3 minutes. Eddie Hodge, out on the right, picked up the ball about 15 yards into the Stoneham half. After taking the ball past a couple of defenders, his low cross to into the six-yard box was diverted into his own net by the luckless Ben Clarke as he slid in to clear.

United continued to have the edge in an open game and almost scored again on 20 minutes when Matty Neale dragged his effort just wide from one of a number of teasing diagonal balls from Jamie Beasley.

United duly doubled their lead on 41 minutes. Another long ball from the left by Beasley eluded a Purps' defender, enabling Dan Cann to find the left corner of the net, wrong footing Parker Trott.

The Hammers almost netted again on the 44 minutes. Beasley forcefully carried the ball down the pitch into the Stoneham box. He finally won a penalty, falling after clear but slight contact by Pip Nolan. Dan Cann's spot kick however was very well saved by Parker-Trott diving low to his right.

The Purps emerged from the break looking the sharper and, just after having a "goal" ruled out for a marginal offside, managed to reduce the deficit on 52 minutes. A perfect ball was delivered across the penalty area from Callum Laycock to half time substitute Sam Woodward, who managed to tuck the ball home across Murphy.

With the away defence now looking strangely hesitant, Stoneham managed to equalize on 57 minutes. The ball quickly found its way down the right side of the pitch following a United corner. With the Hammers outnumbered at the back, Hills finally played the ball across to Sam Woodward to drill into the net, completing a remarkable brace for a player who had only been on the pitch barely ten minutes.

The Hammers however gradually started to settle, compose themselves and return to their normal passing game. Hodge's high diagonal shot was well held by the keeper, while Neale saw a couple of efforts deflected. They eventually regained the lead on 70 minutes when Beasley's well floated corner from the left was powerfully headed into the roof of the net by Tony Rolls.

Stoneham now moved players forward as they fought for the equaliser. Murphy made a couple of good saves, while the Hammers' defence was forced into some desperate clearances, including substitute Sam Chilman doing well to head the ball off the line. Some of these clearances, if more by luck, set up sudden counter attacks, one of which led to Hodge hitting the near post after a good pass by Neale.

Neither team though was able to add to add to their tally before the final whistle. The visitors probably deserved their win, even if in the end they made heavy weather of it after a first half of fine football that they should have ended at least three goals to the good. The game was also pleasant entertainment for the neutral, hard fought but not ugly, with plenty of switching of play.

**United were hoping to make it nine league wins in twelve, in a remarkable run that has seen them climb to third place, although having played more games than most of their rivals.**

This included a 0-2 win at Shaftesbury in mid-November. Their once Dorset Combination rivals have certainly not disgraced themselves since gaining back to back promotions to the Wessex Premier this season. Before this game they sat in a handy ninth place, and were unbeaten this year. Jamie Gleeson's hamstring was still not 100% and Dan Cann was on holiday, but United were still able to utilize their big squad with starts for Jamie Filkins and Steve Smith.

The hosts had most of the early possession, with Shaftesbury's stopper Dan Card pushing out a low strike from Darren Watts. Jamie Beasley's cross, though perhaps more by chance, ended up coming back off the bar, before Card again saved well from Eddie Hodge. However, Hamworthy keeper Andy Knights showed he too was in form, needing to be at full stretch to tip over a dipping shot by Jack Mitchell. Jamie Filkins was then teed up nicely by Chris Clarke, but once again Card got down well to save superbly with his legs. The game did tend to get a bit scrappy and petulant towards the end of the half. The Hammers if anything did look the more likely to score, but were only playing well in patches against a stubborn opposition.

The game soon livened up after the break, with home keeper Knights saving well at his near post from Sam Adetiba, who had been played in by Robert Hatchard. However, his opposite number Card, who was having a fine match, then produced another good save from Watts. With the game finely balanced, it was the Hammers who broke the deadlock on 54 minutes. Jamie Beasley's close-range finish to Chris Clarke's cross from the right, took a wicked deflection into the net off the boot

of Shaftesbury man Aarron White. One had to feel sympathy for the busy keeper Card who otherwise may well have saved it. Just after that Card made another point blank save from Filkins who had been put through by Eddie Hodge.

The Hammers doubled their lead on 65 minutes. If there was any doubt whether the first goal was to go down in the records as an own goal, there was no doubt about the second. Sam Clarke's cross, again from the right, was somehow turned upwards and into his own net by Jason Beal. This was despite of a valiant leap by Card, who could not quite reach the ball. Most of the pressure was now coming from Hamworthy. Shaftesbury did however manage to pull a goal back in the 87th minute. Knights first moved superbly to push over a venomous shot by Nick Hewlett.

However, from Adam Flint's resulting corner, Martin Shroeder powered home a close-range header. Knights again did well to instinctively get his palms to the ball, and almost kept it out. Hamworthy held on for a nervy final few minutes to claim the win, but certainly knew that they had been in a battle. Both goalkeepers had outstanding games, Card standing out more, if only because he had been much the busier. It was cruel luck for him to be beaten by two own goal deflections that he could do nothing about. Though the Hammers were not at their best and never really got into a proper rhythm, the three points could prove valuable in the rankings come the end of the season.

The club was established in 1888 and by the 1905–06 season were winners of the Dorset Junior League. The club became members of the Dorset Senior League for the start of the 1931–32 campaign and a season later were winners of the competition.

After the Second World War the club played in the FA Cup for the first time, reaching the Extra Preliminary Qualifying round before being knocked out by Alton Town. The club became one of the founder members of the Dorset Football Combination League at the start of the 1957–58 season.

Four seasons later the club reached the final of the Dorset Senior Cup, for the first time but lost out to Dorchester Town. The club continued in the Combination until the end of the 1961–62 competition, when they dropped into the Dorset leagues again.

The 1976–77 Season saw the club return to the Dorset Combination league. The club went on to win the combination league in the 1988–89 competition. They repeated another title success again in the 1996–97 campaign.

When the Wessex Football League expanded for the start of the 2004–05 campaign, the club moved to the newly created Division two.[7] The next season saw the club enter the FA Vase for the first time, where they were knocked out in the First Qualification

round by Westbury United. The club stayed in the Wessex league a further season, when they finished bottom of the league and were relegated to the Dorset Premier Football League. In 2013–14, Shaftesbury Town continued their Dorset Premier League challenge, starting on 10 August against Wareham Rangers.

**Ground**  
Shaftesbury play their home games at Cockrams, Coppice Street, Shaftesbury, SP7 8PF. But, when the council refused to give planning permission, the club called upon the local sponsor and supermarket, Tesco. Tesco built the club a new playground and a huge sheltered stand which is estimated to have around 200 - 300 persons capacity.

The club have played at Cockrams since moving there in 1974. The ground belongs to the local Shaftesbury council who lease the ground to the club.

# COVID UPDATE: At the Specsavers

---

'I know we are all pleased to be back playing football, but from the beginning, we have been playing under tight controls from The Wessex League, The FA, and of course the Government!

Covid-19 has NOT gone away, despite what anyone may think? We still have to be on our guard and ensure that we still wash or sanitise our hands regularly, we maintain social distancing wherever we go, especially now we can only have a maximum of 6 people in any group, both inside and out, and continue to 'Track & Trace' wherever we go.

Despite all this, the numbers of people becoming infected with Covid-19 is still increasing? Large parts of the UK are still in regional lock-down, and even infections in the Bournemouth/Christchurch/Poole conurbation have gone from 1:100,000 people to 25:100,000 people in recent weeks.

We still have so much to do to stay safe in our every day life, so it is in the interest of safety, we are insisting that everyone entering the ground to watch Hamworthy United MUST wear a Face Mask.

The Face Mask will stay worn all around the ground, including seating in the stand or standing in the Irvin Brown Stand, and especially when entering the clubhouse.

# COVID AND FOOTBALL

Battered and bruised after a series of blows, this one could be fatal.

Boris Johnson recently announced that the return of supporters to football grounds will be delayed indefinitely, potentially for up to six months, and the implications for the English game are dire.

The pandemic has left club finances decimated by the absence of matchday revenue, chiefly those lower down the pyramid that are more reliant on movement through the turnstiles. The plan was for fans to return to grounds at 25-33% capacity on October 1, but with coronavirus cases rising, the Prime Minister was left with little option but to push the date back. Announcing new restrictions in the House of Commons on Tuesday, Johnson said: "We have to acknowledge that the spread of the virus is now affecting our ability to reopen business conferences, exhibitions and large sporting events.

"I recognise the implications for our sports clubs which are the life and soul of the communities, and my right honourable friends the Chancellor and the Culture Secretary are working urgently on what we can now do to support them."

More than 100 sports organisations recently signed a letter requesting a financial support package from the government. Johnson, however, is yet to commit to anything after the arts industry was granted £1.6billion in July. Further talks were held with the Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Sports and Media, Oliver Dowden, with EFL clubs standing to lose around £200 million if stadiums remain empty throughout the winter, while the Premier League revealed in a statement that it is currently incurring

losses of more than £100million per month.

It is in the National League, though, where the stakes are highest. With the league having been in hibernation for six months, October 3 was slated as their day of salvation, the day that both football and fans would return. The new restrictions, however, have torn the plans to pieces.

The "elite status" that the National League applied for in June has barred clubs from hosting matches with reduced capacity crowds, as it has meant that the leagues are now governed by the same rules as the Premier League and the EFL. Clubs are at an impasse as to whether they should carry on with the season regardless, given the lack of substantial revenue outside of gate receipts. With the furlough scheme coming to an end and the government yet to issue a rescue package, the big question is how clubs will source the money to pay their players, many of whom are full-time.

The growing feeling among club chairmen and secretaries is that, without significant intervention, this will not be possible. Ken Wright, chairman of National League North's Chorley Town, told The Athletic: "We rely totally on gate receipts and sponsorship. It's getting increasingly difficult to keep our head above the water. And it can't go on indefinitely."

Insolvency has become a very real prospect and for some, it is imminent. The demise of Macclesfield Town, although not entirely Covid-related, is a case in point.

Nigel Travis, the owner of League Two side Leyton Orient told Sky Sports News: "They [the government] have not been

very helpful to sports at all, they are incredibly inconsistent with their approach and I think it's time for Boris Johnson to put some money behind us.

"There's a lot of clubs in League One, League Two and the nine levels of football below us. The government needs to do more. They need to step up and give football and some other sports some support.

Joey Barton, the manager of League One side Fleetwood Town, believes part of the responsibility lies with the high earners at the top of the game. "People are getting discarded and made redundant, and clubs are being closed. That is just wrong," he said. "I have been at the top of the table and I have earned loads of dough, and I didn't complain when I earned it. But when you see players earning £300,000, £400,000, £500,000 a week and we have got clubs here that are struggling to keep the electricity on, clubs that are struggling to pay and have enough players to complete fixtures, it is just wrong. We have to protect the game from itself."

It's a sentiment shared by many in the game at the moment - the government themselves appeared to single out the Premier League as an organisation that should be doing more to help out the rest of the industry. There is, after all, a case to say the league is partly responsible. Wage inflation at the top of the game inevitably trickles its way down, and now, in this time of crisis, the clubs with disproportionate levels of income are feeling the full effects.

The Premier League has incurred no shortage of losses either but, unlike the clubs lower down the pyramid, its teams can depend upon alternative revenue streams. Matchday revenue constituted just 5% of Burnley's total income in 2018-19 but provides around 90% of the money for National League sides, leaving a chasm in their finances.

It's an interesting point, and whether the Premier League actually has enough spare "wealth" to distribute is another debate.

The inertia, as Ken Wright said, "can't go on indefinitely".
